Who We Are

Unisoft Medical uses proprietary heat-sealing technology to produce the **first** cost-effective, recyclable healthcare mattress designed to prevent and treat pressure injuries **and** provide optimal infection control.

- » Unisoft Medical is a womanowned company, spun off from Trlby Innovative, a design and engineering company, in October of 2015.
 - UMC currently occupies a **25,000 sqft facility** in Torrington, Connecticut, and has **10 full-time employees**.
- » UMC equipment was designed and built in-house and embodies extensive proprietary IP.
- » Currently, our Gen. I Mattress Equipment is complete and producing approx. 6,000 units annually/shift.

the Data behind the Problem

PRESSURE ULCERS

- » Annually, an estimated 3 million patients in the United States are treated for pressure injuries.¹
- » Pressure injuries cost the U.S. healthcare industry around \$26.8 billion per year² and an estimated additional cost of \$43,180 per hospital stay.³
- » More than 17,000 lawsuits related to pressure injuries are filed annually, making them the second most common healthcare lawsuit subject after wrongful death.³
- » 60,000 U.S. patients die annually as a direct result of pressure ulcers.³

HEALTHCARE-ASSOCIATED INFECTIONS

- » Each day, 1 in 31 U.S. hospital patients develops at least one healthcare-associated infection.⁴
- » HAIs are the primary cause of preventable death among patients in the United States.⁵
- » Using a mattress previously used by a patient with an infection increases one's own risk by 583%.6

CONTAMINATED MATTRESSES

- » 30% of hospital mattresses have invisible damage, which allows pathogens to infiltrate the mattress interior.⁷
- » In 2013, the FDA released a safety alert, warning healthcare workers and care providers of the dangers and risks of worn and damaged medical bed covers.⁸

Protective

Bleach and hydrogen peroxide compatible materials, a level 4 viral barrier non-woven cover, and **no internal fittings or fillings**.

Cost-effective and recyclable, a viable option for single-patient use - eliminating the risk of cross-contamination.



Compact

Weighs just 6.7 lbs and can be stored in a compact, vacuum-sealed bag.

Suitable for use in all healthcare facilities and patient homes. Easy setup and requires minimal training. Integrated side rails prevent head entrapment, and provide safer egress.





COVID 19 - What We've Learned

MATTRESSES BECOME HIGH-ANXIETY AREAS

- » Porous surfaces, like the foam used in healthcare mattresses, are easily contaminated. Once this occurs, the CDC instructs soft porous surfaces to be manually cleaned with soap and water, laundered if possible, and disinfected using a recommended list of approved disinfectants.¹⁴ Healthcare mattresses are not bleach compatible.
- » However, these mattresses cannot be laundered. The outer covering can be disinfected, but should the cover be compromised in any way and the foam contaminated, it becomes nearly impossible to thoroughly disinfect.

HOSPITALS BECOME OVERWHELMED

- » Hospitals consistently reached and exceeded their capacities, placing immense pressure and workloads on nursing and support staff.¹⁵
- » With rising admission rates and increased patient turnover, nurses and support staff have less time and resources for lengthy, labor-intensive mattress cleaning protocols.

PRESSURE ULCERS ON THE RISE

- » At-risk patients are ultimately spending an increased amount of time in bed, due to isolation, illness, and canceled activities.
- » Due to this, the National Pressure Injury Advisory Panel expects an increase in pressure injury instances. 16

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
